From City Hall:

The following minutes are from the July 13th business meeting. As of print time the minutes have not been approved by the council.

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were HAMLIN, NUESSEN, BURTON and BIRK. Hinrichs arrived at 7:04 p.m. Also, present were City Clerk Marcia Johnson, City Attorney Steve Atherton, maintenance Nick Gadino and officer Marcial Hernandez.

VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: No visitors present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: June 8th business meeting and June 10th special meeting. Moved by HAMLIN to approve the minutes of the June 8th business meeting. Motion seconded by BURTON, 4-0 vote. The June 10th minutes were tabled until HIN-RICHS arrives. Moved by HAMLIN to approve the special meeting minutes of June 10th. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 3-0 vote. BIRK and BURTON abstained.

BILLS TO PAY: Moved by NUESSEN to approve the bills to pay in the amount of \$262,242.72, the check to A-1 to be held until the video requirement is completed. Motion seconded by BURTON, 5-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES: BURTON reported from maintenance; a letter was received and read to the council recognizing Nick and John for their hard work. Maintenance has been working on roads. The department has been putting chip and seal on Pine and Second streets. Nick reported they have been working on a cracked synchronizer on the dump truck and the John Deere tractor lost a gear selector, repairs were made.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by HINRICHS to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by BURTON, 5-0 vote.

- 1. HEARIANG BEFORE THE COUNCIL: John & Freda Birchmeier. Tabled until August meeting.
- 2. 2022 BUDGET: Draft of 2022 budget. The council has two budget drafts. The first draft assumes the city will adopt a revenue neutral budget. The second draft, assumes the city will levy the same mill levy as 2021. The difference between keeping the same tax levy as 2021 and the revenue neutral rate is a reduction of \$5,968.00. There is a 5% wage increase figured, health insurance is held at a maximum of \$500 per month per eligible employee. Law enforcement expenses are based on hours they worked in 2020 with 150 hours more for the chief and 300 more hours for officers. Requests included in the budget are \$5,000 for condemnation, \$5,100 for community center operations, \$15,000 to resurface the parking on the East side of the 600 block of Main St., \$45,000 for chip and seal. There is \$10,000 towards the purchase of a a dump trailer and recycle shed renovations that is funded by a transfer from trash. Other transfers included in the budget are \$10,000 towards the Sycamore bridge replacement, \$10,000 to the capital improvement fund to recoup fire hydrant costs and other unfunded general expenditures, \$3,000 towards replacing the mower, \$2,000 for balance of backhoe purchase, \$3,000 towards a utility truck replacement, \$5,000 for tennis court renovation and \$5,000 for other park improvements. There is also \$25,000 budgeted for youth. Resolution 282 states the intent to levy a property tax exceeding the revenue neutral rate. Moved by HAMLIN to go with the budget with the same levy rate as 2021 adopting resolution no. 282. Motion seconded by BIRK, 5-0 vote.
- 3. PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: Ball Field
 - **a.** Musco Lighting: A check from Project Playscape was written to the city for the lighting, allowing for the purchase to be tax exempt and the warranty would be in the cities name. The lighting has been delivered and is in storage. The past weekend was demo day at the complex, all went well.
 - **b. Fundraiser Weekend:** A weekend of fundraisers has been scheduled for July 30th, 31st and August 1st. HINRICHS is requesting for Broadway Street to be closed between Fifth and Main Streets on July 31st for the car show. Friday evening will be an event at the Jones Aquatic Center from 6:00 8:00 pm, Saturday there is a dodgeball tournament from 8:30 am noon, car show from 11:00 am 3:00 pm and events at Harry and Lloyds from 3:00 pm until midnight. Moved by HAMLIN to close Broadway from Main to Fifth Street on July 31st between 9:00 am to 4:00 p.m. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 5-0 vote.
 - **c. Auction Items:** HINRICHS has items that were removed from the park on demo day. The items include play equip ment and items left over from the pool including chairs. Items will be offered at auction to the public. The council would like to consider moving the spring riding toys to a new location within a city park. Project Playscape has scheduled for the park to be sprayed to kill off the grass (30-40 days prior) in order to begin the dirt work.
 - **d. Pool House:** Project Playscape will begin cleaning out the pool house for renovations. Unused items will be removed and placed for auction.
- **4. PROJECT PLAYSCAPE:** *Splash Pad information and guidance.* The council reviewed the options for a splash pad. HIN-RICHS will contact Matt Cline from Aquatix with questions from the council. A special meeting will be scheduled for Tuesday the 20th at 6:00 at the city park to determine the location of the splash pad and review the design. Additional projects to include in the grants for the park include updating of the basketball courts with possible new fencing, bathrooms and installing a shade (awning) area near the splash pad with benches. The Emporia Community Foundation Match Day is November 15th between 9:00 5:00, Project Playscape has been chosen to be a part of Match Day. Any donations made after October 1st to the end of the day on November 15th will be matched.
- **5. PARKS & RECREATION:** *Approval of expenditure.* A light pole in the city park has rotted off at the top, dropping the lines. The estimate from Schumann Electric to replace the pole and remount the lines is \$1,787.58. Moved by Burton to approve the expense not to exceed \$1,787.58 to replace an electrical pole and guide wire in the park. Motion seconded by HINRICHS, 5-0 vote.

6. **AMERICAN LEGAL PUBLISHING:** *Update of code books.* American Legal Publishing updates the City Code books. With Covid the updates have not been done for 2 years. The estimate to bring the Code up to date for 80 pages is approximately \$2,200 plus shipping and handling. Moved by HINRICHS to approve the purchase to update the code books, not to exceed \$2,500. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 5-0 vote.

Moved by HAMLIN to adjourn at 8:24 pm. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 5-0 vote.






