From City Hall:

The following minutes are from the January 11th business meeting. As of print time the minutes have not been approved by the council.

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were HAMLIN, NUESSEN, BIRK, and HINRICHS. Councilmember absent was BURTON. Also present were City Clerk Marcia Johnson, City Attorney Steve Atherton, City Treasurer Brian Anstey, Police Chief Jody Meyers, and maintenance Nick Gadino. **VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD:** No visitors present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: December 14, 2021. Moved by HINRICHS to approve the minutes of Tuesday, December 14th. Motion seconded by BIRK, 4-0 vote.

BILLS TO PAY: Moved by HINRICHS to pay the January bills in the amount of \$12,011.40. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES: The council received the sales, highway, and liquor tax report from 2015 – 2021. Nick reported 3.5 miles of road including radius work were chip and sealed in 2021, using 368,000 ton of rock and 11,403 gallons of oil. The department is starting to rock roads and fix the railing at City Hall. Nick is getting bids to replace the mower.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by NUESSEN to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by HAMLIN, 4-0 vote.

- 1. SURPLUS EQUIPMENT: Opening of sealed bids. Parks, recreation, and pool surplus items were put out for sealed bids. Bids were received from; Marcia Johnson, \$25 for lot #15, and \$10 for lot #20, Ashley Fehr \$8 for lot #16, Brian Anstey, \$10 each for lots #19 and #21, and Nicky Nuessen \$22 for lot #18, \$20.50 for lot #22, \$20.50 for lot #23, \$20.50 for lot #24 and \$10.50 for lot #25. Moved by HINRICHS to accept the bids. Motion seconded by HAMLIN, 4-0 vote. Moved by NUESSEN to dispose of the remaining surplus property. Motion seconded by HINRICHS. 4-0 vote.
- 2. PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: Update on Ball Field Complex and Splash Pad Projects. HINRICHS reported the lights are going up, waiting for the ground to freeze in order to complete putting the rest of the lights up. The fencing and irrigation will be going in next. HINRICHS is getting bids for doors to replace in the concession stand building. Fundraisers are being planned, along with a couple of Sunday breakfasts. HINRICHS is continuing to apply for splashpad grants and is putting together a grand opening for the ball field complex.
- 3. 2021 AUDIT: GAAP waiver resolution and audit engagement letter. Moved by HAMLIN to adopt GAAP Waiver resolution 285. Motion seconded by HINRICHS, 4-0 vote. The council received the letter of understanding of services provided by Cindy Jensen for the City of Americus audit services for the year ending 2021. Moved by HAMLIN to approve Cindy Jensen's audit engagement letter. Motion seconded by HINRICHS, 4-0 vote.

- **4. BLOCK 20:** Hayfield agreement review. Council discussion on the future plans for the property. Maintenance recommended the city retain the lot with the water well. The City of Americus currently has an agreement for haying of the property. In accordance with the agreement, either party can terminate the agreement at any time on 30 days written notice prior to March 1st. Moved by NUESSEN to cancel the hay agreement on block 20. Motion seconded by BIRK, 4-0 vote.
- **5. NEWSLETTER:** Distribution. Discussions on the benefits and costs of mailing out the newsletter vs. distributing the newsletter to businesses for pickup. The consensus of the council is to mail out the newsletter starting with the February newsletter. eventually phasing back to online in the future.
- **6. ORDINANCE 607:** Floodplain Management, draft. Ordinance 607 adopts the new flood maps for the City of Americus. The state has included recommended additional standards. Legal recommends the additional standards be incorporated into the ordinance. Once the additions are incorporated, a draft is to be sent to the state for approval. Once the state approves the ordinance the city can then adopt it. The ordinance will need to be adopted prior to June 15th.
- **7. FILED COMPLAINTS:** *Dogs running at large.* A complaint has been filed on two dogs running at large around the neighborhood of 5th Street and Maple/Pine Streets. The owner has been identified. A citation has been served for no registration X2. The owner was also served a warning for allowing the dogs to run at large. The police department will continue to follow up on the matter. The complainants are willing to sign a citation if the dogs are found running at large again.
- **8. S&A TELEPHONE:** *Letter of support.* S&A Telephone is applying for a Broadband Acceleration Grant through the Kansas Department of Commerce. S&A Telephone has inquired if the city would support the grant by writing a letter to the Ks. Department of Commerce. The consensus of the council is to send a letter of support to the Kansas Department of Commerce supporting the efforts of S&A Telephone. Moved by HAMLIN to adjourn at 7:56 p.m., motion seconded by BIRK, 4-0 vote.




