The following minutes are from the January 10th business meeting. As of print time the minutes have not been approved by the council.

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were NUESSEN, HINRICHS, BURTON, and HARMON. HAMLIN was absent. Also present were City Clerk Jana Smart, City Attorney Steve Atherton, City Treasurer Brian Anstey, Police Chief Jody Myers and maintenance Nick Gadino. VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: Bobby Thompson, Luke Schnakenberg, Stan Grimwood, and Francis

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: December 13 th business meeting. Moved by HARMON to approve the December 13 th business meeting. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 3-0-1 vote.

BILLS TO PAY: Moved by HINRICHS to approve the accounts payable for December 2022 in the amount of \$17,117.82. Motion seconded by BURTON, 4-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

MAINTENANCE: The new fire hydrant has been installed at Third and Orange. Replaced the north sewer pumps and they are up and running. Maintenance is in need of new bristles for the broom for chip/seal. There is money in the chip/seal budget, Nick has done extensive research and the total will be \$735.16.

PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: Midland Fence is coming to finish the outer fencing within the next few weeks. April 22 nd is the date for the 2 nd annual banquet. The order is in for the materials for the Splash Pad.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by HINRICHS to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

1. BOBBY THOMPSON: Flint Hills Gravel Ride Bobby is here to request a few things for the gravel ride in April. There will be a lot more going on this year, around 700 athletes will be coming to town including cyclists and runners. The rider check-in is all in Americus on Friday night this year. Requests include: Barricades, Community Center from April 5 th -April 9 th , having Locust Street from Main Street through Fifth Street closed from Friday night at 6 p.m. to Saturday night at 10 p.m., and the basketball courts closed Friday night as they will be setting stuff up on the courts. Moved by HINRICHS to close Locust Street from Main Street east through Fifth Street from Friday, April 7 th at 6 p.m. through Saturday, April 8 th at 10 p.m. contingent on consent from the county. Motion seconded by BURTON. 4-0 vote. Bobby left at 7:15 p.m.

- 3. BMAC ENTERPRISES: Building questions/College block They want to let us know they are interested in purchasing the College Block, they think Americus has great potential. They have built 8 houses since 2019, and are working on 2 more. There are 16 lots on the college block. Council would like to send it back to Planning and zoning to set lots up. Steve will check into this. Luke Schnakenberg, Stan Grimwood and Francis Springeman left at 7:32 p.m.
- **4. USD 251**: Strategic Planning Committee letter USD 251 would like the Council to nominate a community member to serve on the Strategic Planning Committee. This person will help the committee review the school facilities study and engage in long-term strategic planning for 21st-century schools. Council nominates Bill Harmon.
- **5. FLINTHILLS SHOOTOUT**: Sponsorship Tournament sponsorship with KVOE is \$160.00. The consensus of the council is to go ahead with the sponsorship.
- **6. FILED COMPLAINT:** Cats There is a complaint filed with City Hall about multiple cats roaming freely in their neighborhood. Council would like a notice of violation issued to the owner of the cats. Owners need to get a kennel license.
- 7. ORDINANCE 615: Vacating a portion of Sycamore Street Discussion on having more permanent barriers. Council would like maintenance to get the prices for concrete jersey barriers and order a dead-end sign. Moved by NUESSEN to adopt Ordinance 615 to vacate a portion of Sycamore Street. Motion seconded by HARMON. 4-0 vote.
- **8. CONDEMNATION:** There was a discussion on the lists that were provided by the Council on properties of concern. Will compile the lists and get with code enforcement and the building inspector to move forward in notifying owners.
- **9. EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Non-elected personnel matters Moved by BURTON to go into Executive Session at 8:23 p.m. for 10 minutes for non-elected personnel matters with Mayor, council, and legal present. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 4-0 vote.


NEW POLICY in effect:




