The following minutes are from the May 12th business meeting. As of print time the minutes have not been approved by the council.

**CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL:** Meeting called to order at 7:00 by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were HAMLIN, NUESSEN, BIRK and BURTON. Council member HINRICHS joined at 7:08 p.m. Also present were City Clerk Marcia Johnson, City Attorney Steve Atherton, City Treasurer Kelly Siebert, Police Chief Jody Meyers and maintenance Nick Gadino.

**VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD:** Marie Miller, Cheryl Henry and Joe Leiszler. Laverne Soetebier arrived at 7:39 p.m.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** *April 14, 2020 business meeting.* Moved by HAMLIN to approve the minutes of April 14<sup>th</sup> business meeting. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

**BILLS TO PAY:** Moved by HAMLIN to pay the May bills in the amount of \$22,562.47. Motion seconded by BURTON, 4-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES: Nick Gadino reported from maintenance, the department has been cleaning out ditches, helping APAC with the street project and painting of the parking stalls. The fire truck is ready to go for culvert cleaning. The maintenance department would like to thank the school district for the donation of the ¾ ton Dodge truck.

HAMLIN reported that maintenance purchased ornamental bushes to plant by the shelter house in the park.

Steve Atherton reported on the College & Park blocks, legislators will be back in session for the day next Tuesday to pass legislation that has gone through the process.

BIRK reported he would like to see more asphalt replacement next year.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by HAMLIN to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by BIRK, 5-0 vote.

1. **EXECUTIVE SESSION:** *Preliminary discussions relating to the acquisition of real property.* Moved by HAMLIN to go into executive session at 7:12 for the purpose of acquisition of real property with the council, mayor, legal and Marie Miller present for 15 minutes. Motion seconded by BURTON, 5-0 vote. Back in session at 7:32p.m.

Marie Miller left at 7:34 p.m.

Moved by HINRICHS to add an executive session to the agenda (*Preliminary discussions relating to the acquisition of real property*). Motion seconded by HAMLIN, 5-0 vote.

At this time the Zoom meeting service went off and the meeting had to be restarted.

Lavern Soetebier arrived at 7:39 p.m.

2. **2021 BUDGET REQUESTS:** At the end of 2019 there was \$14,000 for mower replacement, \$40,000 for bridge (culvert) replacement, \$5,750 for pickup replacement. In 2020 there is budgeted \$10,000 to go to ward the bridge replacement. With the donation of the pickup with a snow blade from the school district, a 1-ton pickup will not be needed to replace the current pickup. The funds could be used to replace the pickup with an equivalent pickup. Council member requests for the 2021 budget; \$3,000 towards a lawn mower, bridge (culvert) replacement - \$10,000, pickup replacement - \$3,000, chip & seal project - \$30,000.

Went off line with Zoom, re-entered into Zoom meeting at 8:14 p.m. Cheryl Henry did not rejoin the meeting.

Laverne Soetebier left at 8:16 p.m.

3. **YEARLY APPOINTMENTS**: The Recycle Center has been operated by Jason Dye. Mr. Dye will work the Recycle Center until the end of the grant period that will be around the end of July. Moved by HAMLIN to approve appointments as presented with the addition of maintenance over the recycle center. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 5-0 vote.

- 4. **RESOLUTION #275:** *Discharge of fireworks.* The Fourth of July is on a Saturday in 2020. The current hours of discharge in the resolution are 10:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. Moved by HINRICHS to approve resolution #275 with the days July 2, through July 5 with the hours of 10:00 a.m. till 12:00 a.m. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 4-1 vote, BIRK voted against.
- 5. **SEWER:** Approval of maintenance agreement with A-1 Pump & Jet. Moved by HAMLIN to approve the 3-year agreement with A-1 Pump & Jet. Motion seconded by BURTON, 5-0 vote.
- 6. **FUNDRAISER:** Approval for use of sidewalk and temporary liquor license. PASS until a date is set.
- 7. **ANIMAL CONTROL:** *Impound of cats.* The city does not require cats to be registered with the city. When a cat is picked up and taken to Emporia it costs the city \$40. Consensus of council to continue taking stray cats to Emporia with the approval from the city.

**COVID-19:** Opening of the playground equipment and City Hall. During Phase two of the state's reopening plan, the playgrounds can be opened with social distancing and informative signage required. Outdoor restrooms can open in phase 2 only with daily sanitation, informative signage required. Consensus of council to follow the lead of the county on reopening playground, restrooms and City Hall.

BIRK reported that commercial tree trimmers are dumping loads at the limb dump sight. Moved by BIRK to have maintenance to place signs at the limb dump site, stating that limb and concrete dumping by Americus citizens only. No limbs bigger than 1 foot in diameter. Motion seconded HAMLIN, 5-0 vote.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Moved by BIRK to go into executive session at 8:35 for 10 minutes with council, Mayor and legal present. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 5-0 vote.

Out of executive session and back into regular session at 8:44 p.m. Moved by HINRICHS to approve for the Mayor to negotiate terms, not to exceed \$1,500. Motion seconded by HAMLIN, 5-0 vote.

Moved by HAMLIN to adjourn at 8:46 p.m. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 5-0 vote.
