

AMERICUS CITY COUNCIL **BUSINESS MEETING** TUESDAY, APRIL 9, 2024 7:00 P.M.

CITY HALL

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were HAMLIN, BURTON, NUESSEN, and HARMON. HINRICHS was absent. Also present were City Clerk Jana Smart, City Attorney Steve Atherton, City Treasurer Brian Anstey, Police Chief Jody Meyers, and maintenance Nick Gadino.

VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: Tim Burton, Megan Dye

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: January 9 th business meeting. Moved by HAMLIN to approve the minutes for the January 9 th business meeting with the amendment that MAYOR WRIGHT is listed as absent. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 3-0-1 vote. BURTON abstained. February 13 th business meeting. Moved by BURTON to approve the minutes for the February 13 th business meeting. Motion seconded by HARMON, 3-0-1 vote. HAMLIN abstained. March 12 th business meeting. Tabled until May.

BILLS TO PAY: Moved by BURTON to approve the accounts payable for April 2024 in the amount of \$47,603.66. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

MAINTENANCE: Has had some training on the new striping machine and it is working very well. Will need to order oil and gravel to start chip/seal. The backhoe needs a new water pump and fan hub bearings, parts are on order and will hopefully be fixed by next week.

PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: The Project Playscape volunteers will be working for tips at Harry & Lloyd's on Saturday, April 13 th . HINRICHS has also applied for Match Day again. Still working on other grants. **CLERK:** No report

PARKS: HAMLIN reported there are 750 signed up for the Flint Hills Gravel Ride this weekend. There will be middle school kids coming to help set up on Friday as well as doing a bike wash on Saturday. John Deere wants to bring up to 8 tractors up for the event and display them in the park. She is asking permission to park in the grass. The consensus of the council is to allow them to park in the grass as long as the weather allows.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by NUESSEN to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by HARMON, 4-0 vote.

CONDEMNATION: 1021 Main. Still working on getting debris off the property. There have been complaints
of burning, Jody will address this. The demo permit is valid for 6 months, will revisit next month. 1010 Main.
 Will have to wait on court proceedings. 409 Broadway. Would like to ask for an extension until the end of the
year to have it torn down. Moved by BURTON to extend city condemnation on 409 Broadway until the
December 10 th , 2024 council meeting so that the owner may have the property torn down in completion by then.
 Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 4-0 vote. 7 Fourth. Still waiting on the title search. 311 Elm. Jody will address
the issue of trash on the property. The council will go over the complete condemnation list at the May council
meeting.

Megan Dye left at 7:24 pm.

2. SPENDING POLICY/AUTHORITY: The council wants the policy updated and streamlined. The last policy is from 2010. There was a discussion on amounts. Moved by HAMLIN to approve the updated spending policy allowing department heads to approve up to \$500 and the mayor to approve up to \$1,000. Anything over \$1,000 will have to be approved by the council. All purchases will still have to be within budget restraints. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 4-0 vote.

3. PRECISION POWER WASHING: Quote. A quote was received from Precision Power Washing to clean both Welcome signs coming into town. The quote is \$350 for both locations or \$200 for one location. Maintenance handles this in-house.

4. FILED COMPLAINT: Bob Kearns. Mr. Kearns believes the city is not being fair to all contractors as the Kansas Statutes state that all electrical, HVAC, and plumbing contractors must have continuing education. According to the contractor's application, the city is only requiring electrical contractors to provide continuing education. After some discussion, the consensus of the council is to update the form and remove the requirement to provide continuing education from the application and to add the requirement for any contractor that is required by the State of Kansas to be licensed to provide the city a copy to keep on file.

5. STEVE'S TRASH SERVICE: There is a complaint about the placement of the dumpster behind Rolling Hills. The consensus of the council is to have the mayor sign and send a letter to Steve's Trash Service addressing this issue.

Moved by BURTON to adjourn at 7:51 p.m. Motion seconded by HAMLIN. 4-0 vote.




NEW POLICY in effect:


