From City Hall:

The following minutes are from the October 11th business meeting. As of print time the minutes have not been approved by the council.

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were NUESSEN, HAMLIN, BURTON, and HINRICHS. HARMON was absent. Also present were City Clerk Jana Smart, City Attorney Steve Atherton, City Treasurer Brian Anstey, Police Chief Jody Meyers, and maintenance Nick Gadino.

VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: Kim Meyers

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: September 13 th public hearing, September 13 th budget hearing, and September 13 th business meeting. Moved by BURTON to approve the September 13 th public hearing. Motion seconded by HINRICHS. 3-0-1 vote. Moved by HINRICHS to approve the September 13 th budget hearing. Motion seconded by BURTON. 3-0-1 vote. BILLS TO PAY: Moved by HINRICHS to approve the accounts payable for October 2022 in the amount of \$23,126.54. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

MAINTENANCE: They had 68 loads of limbs that they burned from the storm and 4 loads of bigger logs that were taken to Emporia to burn. There has been some vandalism in the park.

PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: There was a volunteer that came out and did some drone footage of the field. They used some of the footage for the Match Day video and will use some for a thank-you. On Friday, 10/21 they will be moving bleachers from the garage over to the field to start working on putting them together and will continue working on them into Saturday and Sunday if necessary. They will be having a Pancake/Biscuit & Gravy breakfast on 11/13 at Harry & Lloyd's in Americus.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by BURTON to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by HAMLIN, 4-0 vote.

HARMON arrived at 7:11 p.m.

1. KIM MEYERS: Trunk or Treat Kim is here to let the council know they will be organizing a Trunk or Treat event and pumpkin painting on 10/30/22 from 4-7 p.m., the fire department will do a chili feed Sunday night in conjunction with the event as well as Monday night. There will be a costume and trunk display contest. They are wanting to make this an annual event, and are asking for the city's help in kicking this off with a donation and asking to have Main Street closed from Locust to Broadway from 3-8 p.m. Moved by BURTON to close Main Street from Locust to Broadway on 10/30/22 from 3-8 p.m. contingent upon approval from the county. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 5-0 vote. Moved by HINRICHS to donate \$200 to the Trunk or Treat event. Motion seconded by HARMON. 5-0 vote.

2. MATCH DAY: Project Playscape will be participating in Match Day again this year. Any donations from now until November 14 th will be matched. There are flyers that went out in the newsletters this month that tells people how Match Day works and how you can donate.

3. PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: Christmas Event Request The Christmas Parade is 12/3/22 (first Saturday in December). Project Playscape would like to request \$250 from the city for the Santa bags, books, and prizes that are given away each year. Moved by NUESSEN to donate \$250 to the Project Playscape Christmas event. Motion seconded by BURTON. 5-0 vote.

4. ROLLING HILLS: Liquor license renewal Owner Angie Brockelman has provided the city with a copy of her state license, the liquor license application, and the license fee. Moved by BURTON to approve Rolling Hills liquor license renewal. Motion seconded by HINRICHS. 5-0 vote.

5. FILED COMPLAINTS: Dog running at large A complaint has been filed on a dog running at large around the neighborhood of 4 th Street and Locust/Cherry Streets. The owner has been identified. A citation signed by the complainant has been served for allowing a dog to run at large. Information was given to the council.

6. SEWER: Information/questions about sewer development on First Street There is a developer interested in purchasing and building on the land for sale on First Street but had questions about the cost of sewer being run to it. Council advised having the developer have a contractor look at it and come back to the council with a plan/proposal.

7. CODE ENFORCEMENT: There is concern from the council about code enforcement not getting done. The police department is short on officers right now so they are trying to get things done when they work. If there is an issue that the city is made aware of they contact Chief Meyers and let him know what's going on.

Moved by BURTON to adjourn at 7:37 p.m. Motion seconded by HAMLIN. 5-0 vote.
