From City Hall:

The following minutes are from the October 10th business meeting. As of print time the minutes have not been approved by the council.

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were NUESSEN, HARMON, and BURTON. HINRICHS and HAMLIN were absent. Also present were City Clerk Jana Smart, City Attorney Steve Atherton, City Treasurer Brian Anstey, Police Chief Jody Meyers, and maintenance Nick Gadino.

VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: Bailey Estes and Kim Meyers

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: September 12th public hearing, September 12th budget hearing, and September 12th business meeting. Pass until the November meeting.

BILLS TO PAY: Moved by BURTON to approve the accounts payable for October 2023 in the amount of \$99,672.49. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 3-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: Match Day is coming up on Monday, November 13 th. Forms went out in the October newsletter for donations. If you need a form, you can stop in at City Hall and pick one up. We will have a couple of food fundraisers coming up at the end of October and mid-November, most likely a pancake and biscuit and gravy breakfast and/or potato bar. Contact Britney or Jana if you would like to contribute anything.

MAINTENANCE: Update on roads: maintenance has completed 65 radiuses, a lot of patchwork has been done and Coffman Construction has completed the three new roads on the North side of town.

CLERK: Attended a court clerk conference in Manhattan at the end of September and also attended the League conference in Wichita the first weekend in October.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by BURTON to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by HARMON. 3-0 vote.

1. KIM MEYERS: Trunk or Treat Event. Kim Meyers is here to give us information on the event and would like to ask the city to sponsor it again this year. The event was a huge success last year and is looking to be even bigger this year. It will be held on Sunday, October 29 th from 3-5 pm. There will be a lot of different activities available for the kids. Kim will contact the county about closing Main Street for the event. Moved by BURTON to sponsor the 2 nd Annual Trunk or Treat Event in the amount of \$300. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 3-0 vote.

- 2. STREET CATS CLUB: Bailey Estes is here to introduce the club to the community. They run a TNR(Trap/Neuter/Return) program to help stop re-population and a foster program in Emporia. They trap all year except for the two weeks around Thanksgiving and Christmas. There is a form available on their website (www.streetcatsclub.org) to fill out if you are in need of their assistance.
- **3. ROLLING HILLS:** Liquor license renewal Owner Angie Brockelman has provided the city with the liquor license application and license fee. She is in the process of renewing her state license. Moved by BURTON to approve Rolling Hills liquor license renewal contingent upon receiving a copy of her state license. Motion seconded by HARMON. 3-0 vote.
- **4. WADE'S BEER & LIQUOR:** Liquor license. Prospective owner Emmanuel Cazares has provided the city with the liquor license application and license fee. He is in the process of applying for his state license. Moved by BURTON to conditionally approve Wade's Beer & Liquor liquor license contingent upon receiving a copy of his state license. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 3-0 vote.
- **5. OPEN BURN POLICY:** Council member Harmon recommends some changes to the policy. Some discussion was had on wording and a few additions. He will make changes and have them ready at the next meeting.
- **6. COLLEGE BLOCK:** Council would like to set a price to sell the lots. Discussion was held on a price to sell at with incentives to build. Moved by BURTON to list 16 lots/8 building plots (2 lots each) for \$6,000 per building plot (2 lots), will contract with build limitations still TBD. Upon completion of the build, if within 18 months, the owner will be reimbursed \$3,000. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 3-0 vote.

 Moved by NUESSEN to adjourn at 7:23 p.m. Motion seconded by BURTON. 3-0 vote.






