RNR PUBLIC HEARINGS FOR THE 2022 BUDGET

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were HAMLIN, NUESSEN, BURTON and BIRK. Council member absent was HINRICHS. Also present were City Clerk Marcia Johnson, City Attorney Steve Atherton and City Accountant Laverne Soetebier.

VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: No visitors present.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by HAMLIN to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

1. 2022 BUDGET: Revenue Neutral Rate. The Revenue Neutral Rate is based off of the amount raised from the previous year. The RNR for Americus was calculated as 34.203 mills. The city shall levy a property tax rate exceeding the RNR by 1.522 mills for a rate of 35.725. Resolution #284 allows the city to levy a property tax rate exceeding the revenue neutral rate. Moved by BURTON to approve resolution 284. Motion seconded by HAMLIN, 4-0 vote.

Moved by HAMLIN to adjourn at 7:03 p.m. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

PUBLIC HEARINGS FOR THE 2022 BUDGET

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: Meeting called to order at 7:03 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were HAMLIN, NUESSEN, BURTON and BIRK. Council member absent was HINRICHS. Also present were City Clerk Marcia Johnson, City Attorney Steve Atherton and City Accountant Laverne Soetebier.

VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: No visitors present.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by NUESSEN to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by BURTON, 4-0 vote.

1. 2022 BUDGET: Proposed budget for adoption. Moved by NUESSEN to adopt the 2022 budget as present. Motion seconded by BIRK, 4-0 vote.

Move by NUESSEN to adjourn at 7:04 p.m. Motion seconded by BURTON, 4-0 vote.

BUSINESS MEETING

CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: Meeting called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Mayor Dustin Wright. Council members present were HAMLIN, NUESSEN, BURTON and BIRK. Council member absent was HINRICHS. Also present were City Clerk Marcia Johnson, City Attorney Steve Atherton and City Accountant Laverne Soetebier.

VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: No visitors present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: August 10, 2021 Due to the lack of quorum from the August meeting, the minutes were moved to the October agenda for approval.

BILLS TO PAY: The statement from Gerald Schumann Electric is awaiting clarification. Moved by HAMLIN to pay the September bills in the amount of \$36,154.67, pending payment on Gerald Schmann Electric for explanation. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES: BURTON reported from maintenance, they still have some chip and seal to do. John is keeping up with the department in Nick's absence this week.

ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by NUESSEN to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by HAMLIN, 4-0 vote. Lavern left at 7:09 p.m.

- 1. PLANNING & ZONING: Water Dist. Membership charge & Article XIV, Section 10, No. 7 of the P&Z Code. The Planning & Zon ing Board is inquiring on the charges by RWD #1 on their membership. Research is needed on the membership costs and what comes with the membership, along with what other water districts charge for new service for comparison. Consensus to table for further research
 - Article XIV, Section 10, No. 7 of the P&Z Code states the age of a modular home being moved into town can be no older than 10 years of age. The Planning and Zoning Board is recommending changing from 10 years of age to 25 years of age or going to a case-by-case basis. Legal Council recommended tabling for further research. Consensus of council to table.
- 2. **NEWSLETTERS:** *Discussion on distribution.* The newsletter is currently not being mailed out. The newsletter is distributed to local business for residents to pick up. There is also a box outside of City Hall for pickup. The newsletter is also put on the city's web page. One option is to offer a subscription of \$1 month/newsletter. The subscription would be for a full year, prorated for 2021. The newsletter will also be published on the cities Facebook page.
- 3. **EMPLOYEE POLICY:** Covid pay no policy was enacted. The city does not have a covid pay policy in place. City Clerk Marcia Johnson spoke with other communities, most require the employee to use sick leave or vacation. The League of Municipality recommended the city have a covid leave policy if the city didn't want to require the use of sick leave or vacation. At this time the council is not interested in a covid leave policy, keeping with the employee policy and procedures manual.
- 4. **MAINTENANCE:** Condition of patch on parking area in the 700 block of Main Street. The asphalt parking on the East side of Main Street in the 700 block was replaced in 2020. The county highway department parked equipment on the newly replaced asphalt caus ing damage. A sealer product was placed on the area, giving one year to revisit. Matt Collins will be called to look at the area.
- 5. **EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Attorney client privileged information. Moved by NUESSEN to go into executive session for attorney client privileged information for 10 minutes with council, legal, mayor and clerk present at 7:39. Motion seconded by HAMLIN 4-0 vote

Back in regular session at 7:49 p.m. no action taken.

Moved by HAMLIN to adjourn at 7:49. Motion seconded by NUESSEN, 4-0 vote.

1% Sales Tax On August 19th the Lyon County Commission passed a Resolution requesting

the extension of the current 1% county-wide sales tax to be placed on the ballot for the Nov. 2nd election. This is not a new tax, but an extension of the current sales tax. If passed the tax would be extended for 15 years. The money from this tax is being used to chip and seal the streets in Americus.






