The following minutes are from the October 14th business meeting. As of print time the minutes have not been approved by the council. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor WRIGHT. Council members present were HARMON, HAMLIN, NUESSEN, and HINRICHS. BURTON was absent. Also, present City Attorney Steve Atherton, City Maintenance Nick Gadino, and City Clerk Dodie Doudna.
VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: Duane Billinger, Tatum Wright, Deb Ghere, Kelli Ghere

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Sept 9th, 2025, business meeting Moved by NUESSEN to approve the Sept 9th, 2025, business meeting minutes. Motion seconded by HARMON. 4-0 vote.

- BILLS TO PAY: Moved by HARMON to approve the Oct bills to pay for \$18406.27. Motion seconded by HINRICHS, 4-0 vote.
- PROJECT PLAYSCAPE: HINRICHS reported that training will be conducted with maintenance on how to close the splash pad for the winter.
- Maintenance will work on a how to guide to be able to have for next year. Hinrichs discussed other Project Playscape activities: Throw Back Prom-
- Nov 15th, Match Day donations start Oct. 17 going through Nov 17th. Permission granted to put Match Day signs around town as in the past.
- Christmas Parade will be on the agenda for next month. MAINTENANCE: Nick brought several repair items to council. Nick reminded council that our equipment is getting older, and these things will continue to pop up. Mayor Wright approved Nick to have Shuman Electric to do work on gas pump for \$966.54. It was moved by HINRICHS to purchase 6 loads of road rock from Eagle Creek in the amount of \$1400. Motion seconded by HARMON.
- 4-0 vote. CLERK: Dodie stated that the old police car had been listed with Purple Wave. Council requested that she list the old maintenance truck as
- well. Quotes for new window blinds were given, Mayor Wright approved purchase of new blinds up to \$500. City Clean up was well received by
- residents and both dumpsters were at capacity. Discussion was had if we want to continue to accept bill payments at the bank. This will be added
- as an agenda item in November. City Hall will be part of the Halloween Parade route with the school. Council Member NUESSEN is donating a water cooler to the city office. Caseys will begin adding a per card charge to our account each month. Council approved purchasing shirts for the new
- staff members. AMEND AND ADOPT THE AGENDA: Moved by HINRICHS to adopt the agenda. Motion seconded by NUESSEN. 4-0 vote.
- 1. ESU EMERSION PROJECT: Tatum Wright presented information about ESU Sociology program wanting to complete a project in Americus. Council approved the use of the community building on Nov. 10 and 11th by the group.
- 2. UNCLAIMED CATS: Deb and Kelli Ghere talked about one of the cat colonies in Americus that they have been caring for. They have vaccinated and spayed and neutered almost all the cats in this colony. More discussion was had on what the city can do to help combat the unclaimed cats.
- HINRICHS is going to set up a meeting with Street Cats Club and Ghere's cat rescue to find some solutions.
- 3.CHIPPER: Reviewed options to replace with a used chipper. Nick will continue to look for others in areas close to Americus. Will continue to monitor an auction that bidding closes on Nov. 18, more discussion will be had at the November council meeting.

DID YOU KNOW?

"Grant Timmerman was born in Americus, Kansas on February 19, 1919. Educated in the public schools of Emporia, Kansas, he graduated from Emporia High School in 1936. He attended Kansas State Teacher's College in Emporia for one year, where he took a pre-engineering course. In the summer of 1937, he went to California and worked as an electric welder at <u>San Mateo, California</u>. He enlisted in the <u>United States Marine Corps</u> in San Francisco on October 28, 1937, and went through United States Marine Corps Recruit Training at San Diego. Shortly after joining the Marine Corps, Grant, was soon sent to serve in China where he served from April 10^{Th} , 1938, until July 1940. In October 27, 1941. He went back to electric welding and got a job. After five weeks of civilian life, the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor and in February 1942, he reenlisted and was reappointed to his old rank of private first class. Since he had only been out of the Marine Corps for four months, the 23-year-old China Marine did not have to repeat basic training, but was immediately sent to the Transport Company at the Marine Corps Base at San Diego. By November that year Grant, and his battalion went to Wellington, New Zealand, and when he crossed the equator, Sgt Timmerman was initiated in the realm of King Neptunus Rex. After a period of intensive training in Wellington, the 2nd Division made their landing on Tarawa, Gilbert Islands on November 20, 1943. However, it was two days later that Sgt Timmerman came in with the tanks. In December, they went to Hawaii for a rest and more training, and in May 1944 left for another combat mission — the last for Timmerman. He landed on Saipan on D-Day, June 6, 1944, and on July 8, Sgt Timmerman's tank, was advancing a few yards ahead of the <u>infantry</u> when the attack was held up by a series of Japanese <u>pillboxes</u> and trenches. The sergeant had been firing the tank's antiaircraft gun during the vigorous attack but when progress was halted, he prepared to fire the 75 mm gun. Exposing himself to the enemy, he stood up in the open turret of his tank to warn the infantry to hit the deck because of the muzzle blast of the 75 mm. A Japanese grenade came hurtling through the air aimed in the direction of the open turret. Grant Timmerman fearlessly covered the opening with his own body to prevent the grenade from killing his crew and the grenade exploded on his chest, killing him instantly. Although two members of the crew received slight wounds from the grenade, none were killed, all the larger fragments being taken by Sgt Timmerman. For that his country bestowed its highest honor upon him - the Medal of Honor. The Medal and also a Bronze Star earned earlier in the Saipan campaign, were presented to his parents on July 8, 1945, the first anniversary of his death, in their home by Col Norman E. True of the Marine Barracks in Great Lakes, Illinois.

Initially buried in the 2nd Marine Division Cemetery on Saipan, Marianas Island, Sgt Timmerman was later reinterred in the National Cemetery of the Pacific in Honolulu, Hawaii."

This quiet informal presentation was made at the request of the Marine's mother.

It's because of the brave young men and women who stood up, served, and sacrificed that we are able to live in freedom today. Their courage and selflessness remind us that the blessings we enjoy did not come without cost. On Veterans Day, we pause to honor those who gave everything — their time, their strength, and in many cases, their lives — so that we could have a safer, better future. We owe them more than words can express, but we can show our gratitude by never forgetting their sacrifice and by carrying their spirit of service in our hearts.
